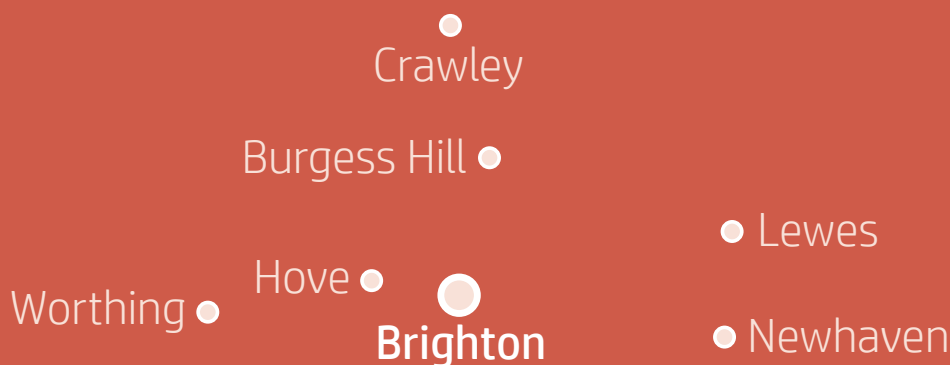


# Home Counties Buses

#### **Brighton & Hove 1/1A/N1**

Whitehawk - Brighton - Hove - Portslade - Mile Oak

Route 1 started in January 1986 between Downs Park and Whitehawk. In 1996 it was revised to end at Mile Oak. The service now boasts 24/7 operation and utilises dual door double deckers new in 2016, running every 6 minutes, with free WiFi.

#### **Brighton & Hove Coaster 12/12A/12X**

Brighton - Peacehaven - Newhaven - Seaford - Eastbourne

Brighton & Hove claims that Coaster 12 is 'one of the most scenic bus routes in all of England' and it's hard to disprove them! Indeed, the views are particularly great at the Eastbourne end of the route. With livery by Best Impressions, it's easy to be tempted onboard these stunning buses.

#### **Stagecoach South Coastliner 700**

Brighton - Worthing - Bognor Regis - Chichester - Portsmouth

Smart, modern buses run frequently throughout the day alongside a night service between Brighton and Worthing. With services up to every 10 minutes along the South Coast and across the South Downs, this scenic route is unmissable!

#### **Brighton & Hove Regency 29/29B/29X**

Brighton - Lewes - Uckfield - Crowborough - Tunbridge Wells

Some 40 years after the service was given the Regency name, Brighton & Hove continue to traverse the route of the old railway lines: Lewes - Uckfield and Eridge - Tunbridge Wells, when closed by British Railways in the 1960s. Until 2005, it was operated jointly with Arriva and Stagecoach.

#### **Metrobus 270**

Brighton - Burgess Hill - Haywards Heath - East Grinstead

Metrobus have a reputation for building robust, quality services, and the 270 is certainly no exception. A new fleet arrived in 2015 and whilst sported a revitalised Metrobus livery, were also kitted out with WiFi, USB/mains sockets and external, off-bus, service announcements.
